BALLOT INFORMATION

This is a <u>Vote By Mail Election</u> so watch for your ballot in the mail. They will begin mailing them the week of **October 14th**. You may return your ballot by mail or drop it off in a secure ballot box at Alpine City Hall (20 N. Main, Alpine, UT). There is also a curbside ballot box on the north side of Highland City Hall across the street from the splash pad.

Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked no later than 5 pm on Monday November 4th (the day before the Election). Ballots received after that day and time will NOT be counted. If you miss the deadline, you may deposit your ballot in the secure ballot box at Alpine City Hall on Election Day (November 5th) before 8 pm.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- If you are not registered to vote as a resident of Alpine, you will not receive a ballot in the mail.
- If you have moved and your registration does not reflect your current address, you will not receive a ballot in the mail. The post office may not forward ballots.
- To register to vote, go to <u>Vote.Utah.Gov</u>. The address on your registration must match the address on your drivers license. You may update the address on your drivers license at **Vote.Utah.Gov**.
- If you are registered but need to update the information on your registration, including your address if you have moved, go to **Vote.Utah.Gov**.
- The last day to register <u>online or in person</u> at the County Clerk's office in Provo and vote in this election is October 29th.

If you do not receive a ballot in the mail or received a ballot but lost it, you may vote provisionally at any Vote Center in Utah County. There will be a Vote Center at Alpine City Hall at 20 N. Main on Election Day which is Tuesday, November 5th from 7 am to 8 pm.

If you received a ballot in the mail but wish to change your vote or have spoiled your ballot, you may surrender the old ballot and receive a new one at the **Vote Center on Election Day**.
