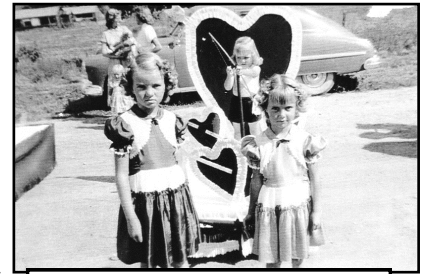
2019 ALPINE DAYS

Truth in Taxation Hearing

The Alpine City Council will hold a Truth in Taxation Hearing on **August 20, 2019, at 7 pm at Alpine City Hall** to take comment on the proposal to increase property taxes to fund the increased costs from the Lone Peak Public Safety District.

The increase is partially due to Cedar Hills leaving the district. Funding the increase will maintain the present level of emergency services for Police, Fire and EMS (emergency medical services) for the citizens of Alpine.

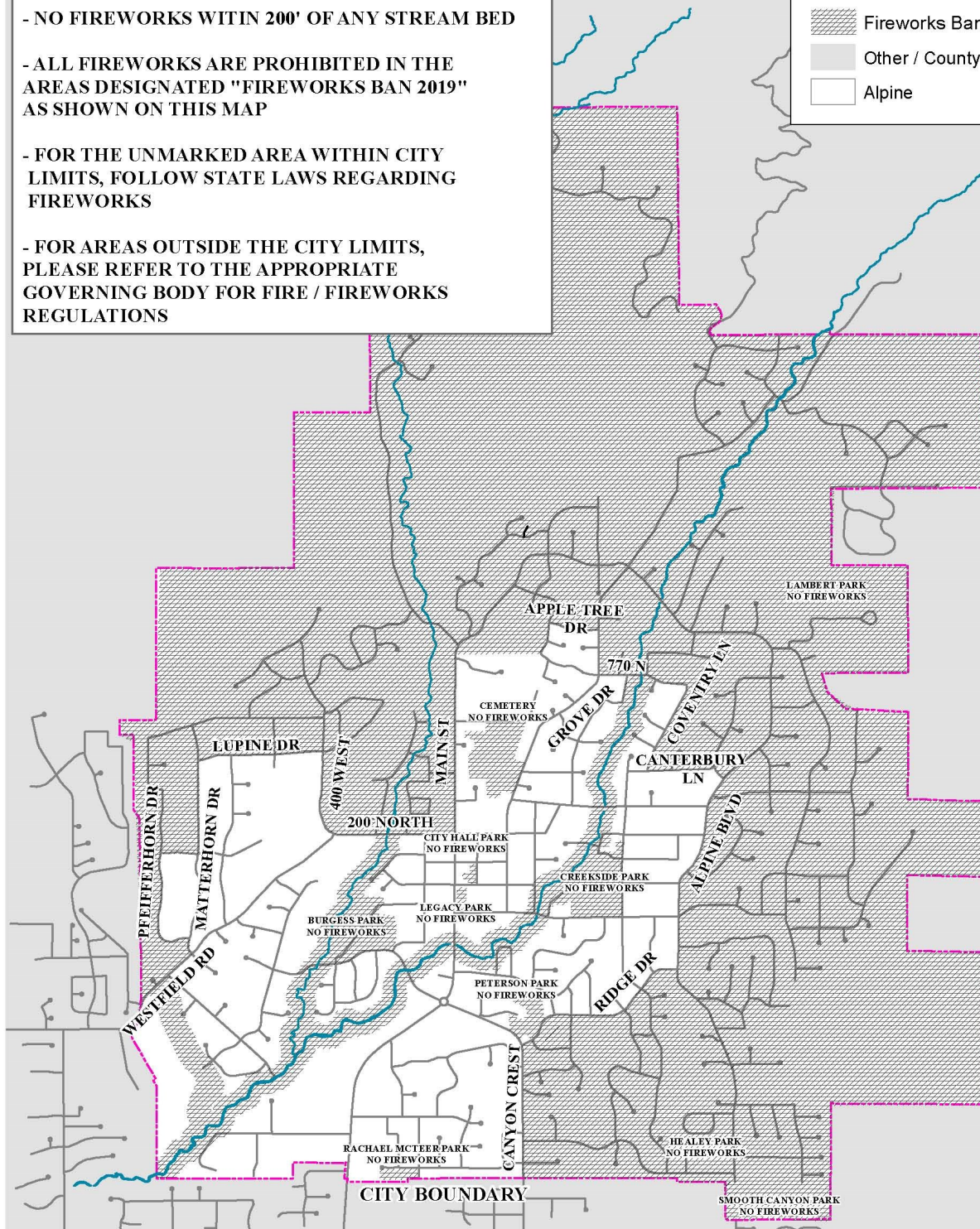
