FIREWORKS



Fireworks are permitted to two (2) days before July 4th and July 24th and one (1) day after. The areas where fireworks are permitted has been changed. See the map on page 2 for the areas in which fireworks are prohibited. **The fine for illegal use of fireworks is \$1,000.**

FREE SHRED DAY at Alpine City Hall (20 N. Main) will be Saturday, September 15th from 9 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. This will be a paper shred and E-shred day.

Trash & recycle pickup will be **delayed one day** for **July 4, 5 and 6**. Service will **continue as usual** for **Pioneer Day and Labor Day**.

URGENT WATER USAGE MESSAGE

Due to the extreme demand on the City's pressurized irrigation system, we have found it necessary to make temporary adjustments to the allowed watering schedule. Effective immediately, all customers will be required to reduce their water budget to 80% of their current run time. Most sprinkler timers have an option where this can easily be done. It is the same setting that is used for seasonal adjustments. Compliance with this change will help avoid further restrictions. We anticipate that with conservation from all users and getting a well back in operation next week, that residents will be able to return to the regular schedule. If you need help setting your system to 80%, please contact the city at 801-756-6347 and we will send someone out to help you with this. Also, see our website at alpinecity.org for directions on how to clean your pressurized irrigation water filter for better efficiency to your system. Thank you for your cooperation with this issue.

Water Report - Car Washing. With the winter being so mild this year, our water supply is struggling to keep up. Here are some things to remember to keep our water ways clean and beautiful while washing our automobiles. Please keep conservation in mind this summer.

- Use a **commercial car wash** facility whenever possible. Their water is recycled or treated before discharged to the sanitary system
- If using a commercial facility is not possible, **wash the car on gravel, grass, or other areas able to absorb the wash water.**
- Use specialty cleaning solution **sparingly**.
- Try to minimize water usage by **using nozzles and/or buckets.**
- **Turn off the hose** when not in use.
- Use a **low-pressure hose**. A high-pressure hose removes more pollutants.
- When cleaning the car interior, **properly dispose or recycle any trash.**
- Try using detergents and soaps that say **"biodegradable"** or **"phosphate free."**

Commit to the Limit Initiative Saves Life of Child

Last Wednesday a resident of Alpine accepted a copy of a "Commit to the Limit" certificate pledging drivers to drive at or below the speed limit while in Alpine. That evening she shared with her family some of the reasons for this initiative, explaining that there are 97 children who live along North Main Street in Alpine. She explained that there is a ratio of speed to death or survival.

For example, if one is hit by a vehicle traveling at 20 mph, they have a 95% chance of survival, at 30 mph: 50% chance of survival, and at 40 mph: almost no chance of survival.

The very next morning, her son was driving down Main Street. He glanced at his speedometer and saw that he was driving 27 mph. He remembered his mother's words and slowed down. As he looked up, a very young child rode down his driveway and into the street in front of him on a little car. The young driver was able to stop in time...but barely. He says if he had been going even a little faster, he wouldn't have had the distance to stop in time. Fortunately, he had committed to drive the limit and it prevented a life changing event for him, a child, two families and a community!

It is time for all of Alpine and those who visit our city to "Commit to the Limit" and show that we care about Alpine, respect the law, our neighbors, and our beautiful community.


