Waste Management

WM of Utah to Begin Servicing Hyde Park



A new waste hauler is coming to town!

Starting the week of October 1, 2023, WM

(formerly Waste Management) of Utah will

begin servicing all the residential customers in Hyde Park. WM is already servicing commercial customers in the city.

WM will collect trash on a weekly basis and recycling every other week from residents. Green waste will be picked up weekly with trash in October and then the service will be paused in November until Spring. WM will mail information to residents in mid-September with the collection schedule. Please watch your mailbox for this update.

Residential customers will continue to be billed for waste services by the city. Residents will use their existing carts for trash, recycling and green waste. WM advises residents to place carts at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on collection day. Trash should be bagged and tied to avoid wind-blown litter. Recycling should be emptied loosely (not bagged) into the cart so that it can be safely separated at the Material Recycling Facility. WM will accept clean paper, cardboard, metal food and beverage cans and plastic containers shaped like bottles, jugs, tubs and jars. WM of Utah was selected as the new service provider for Hyde Park and several other cities in Cache County as part of a contract through Cache Waste Consortium.



Message From Mayor Cox

Summer has come and gone, now the kids are back in school, and Fall will soon be upon us. Hyde Park has continued to be an amazing place to live, we can tell by the number of people coming to this great city.

This summer we've been busy with various projects. Wolfpack Way continues to be in the works and should be having asphalt started the end of August or the first part of September. We'll be working on 575 East to repair the low area. Seal coating should be starting, along with several other small jobs. We also received grants for a "Water Master Plan" which has now been completed, and for a "Stormwater Master Plan". The Stormwater Master Plan is in the works. We continue to search for grants to augment our city. We've a goal of 20% of the city budget in grants and we've exceeded it last year and this year.

Starting in October, we're going to be having Waste Management (WM) as our garbage collection service provider. Businesses have already started. Their selection was a highly competitive process and was selected as the best for 16 communities and unincorporated county. WM will have some mailings for educational purposes as well. Because of the change, our costs will go up a few dollars. We formed a consortium, retained an attorney and have to have someone do a small number of accounting entries that we'll be audited on by the state.

Public Hearing

September 13, 2023

Hyde Park City will hold a public hearing to discuss changing the fee schedule to increase the price of solid waste pick-up and the stormwater utility fee.



When our early Hyde Park settlers purchased burial lots in the cemetery, sometimes they were given a "Cemetery Deed." This is somewhat of a misnomer, because when you purchase a burial lot you do not purchase *real property* but rather the RIGHT for a burial to take place in this location. At certain times during the last century, Hyde Parkers would purchase grave sites and then (thinking they now owned real property) turn around and sell them to others for a profit! This is not the way things work. Remember, your "purchase" entitles you to a "**Right of Interment.**" You can relinquish this "right" to someone else by informing the cemetery administrator of such, return it to the cemetery (who will then reimburse you what you paid for it), or ensure that it will be passed on to other family members through wills and trusts, but you cannot sell this right.

Many folks with burial rights in the cemetery have no documentation stating where they have these rights within the cemetery. While this isn't an absolute necessity, I can understand the desire to "have something in writing." To this end we will be issuing a "Right of Interment" to all heads of family for each gravesite they may have. We'll begin with Block A – which is the north section of the cemetery that parallels Center Street. If you believe your family has burial rights in Block A, but you don't receive a Right of Interment by Sept 30th, please let me know. It probably means I have no record of who the heir to a specific gravesite might be, or I have no contact information for you.

Thank you for continuing to help us maintain the dignity of our cemetery by following the posted guidelines.
