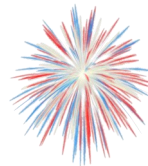

As we roll into February I hope this new year has been good to you and your family. Hyde Park City continues to work towards some big goals this year as well. From the Parks Department we have a few exciting updates that we want you to be aware of for the upcoming year.

Our city has been awarded the Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant in the amount of \$320,000. This grant will aid us in continuing the Bonneville Shoreline Trail through Hyde Park and connecting to Smithfield City boundaries. We are excited to continue this project and hope you have been able to enjoy the partial section of the Bonneville Shoreline Trail that was completed in 2023.

New additions are coming to Lions Park this spring. Watch for the upcoming installation of the new exercise loop at the middle and upper sections of Lions Park. In the exercise loop you will find several stations with strength and stretching modules that you can do at your own pace and incorporate into your exercise routines. We encourage everyone to get out and get active this year!

Another goal I have for the new year is to work towards the designation of Hyde Park City as a Healthy Utah Community. Get Healthy Utah and The League of Cities and Towns supports the Healthy Utah Community designation. This will require a board to meet quarterly and work on plans to implement programs that support mental, physical and emotional health in our community. I have a few volunteers but we are looking for a couple more. If this interests you and you'd like to get involved please reach out to me.

Kindergarten Registration

We are looking for all future kindergarten students!!! If you have a child who will be five on or before September 1, 2024 (OR if you have a family member or neighbor who has a child turning five before September 1, 2024) and will be attending school in Cache County School District, it is time to begin the process of registering that child for kindergarten.

The kindergarten registration process is outlined on the Cache County School District website and is currently open. All parents of future kindergarten students should go to the district website, click on the "For Parents" tab, and find the link for "Kindergarten Registration" under the Registration heading. Registration instructions and requirements are explained there. The direct link is <https://www.ccsdut.org/kinder>.

The online registration process is simple, but there will be some wait time as emails are generated back to the registering parents. It usually takes a couple of days. Once the online process is fully complete, gather the required documents and take them to the school your child will be attending anytime before March 31.

Please note that Kindergarten registration does not have set dates like it has had in the past. Registration is currently open and the process is fluid. The online registration process must be completed **before** coming to the school with the required documents. Schools need to receive your registration documents by March 31. Schools will be open each school day during school hours for you to bring in your documents. On Thursday, February 29, schools will be open until 8:00 pm for those who are not able to bring in their documents during the school day. (Parent Teacher Conferences are also being held that evening.)

If you have any questions, or need more information, please contact the school where the child will be attending kindergarten. We are looking forward to serving your child!
