ALPINE CITY IS VOTING BY MAIL

- **Every registered voter in Alpine City will be sent a BALLOT in the mail** for the 2017 Municipal Election and Special 3rd District Congressional Election. The County will be conducting the election and both municipal and congressional candidates will be on the same ballot.
- **Make sure your Voter Registration is correct and current.** Ballots will NOT be forwarded.
- Your voter registration MUST show your **current** physical address in Alpine. You may indicate a MAILING address which is different such as a PO Box or an out-of-town address, but your voter registration must show your CURRENT physical address in Alpine.
- Go to **VOTE.UTAH.GOV** to check on your registration information. You may also register to vote at this site or update your registration and information. If you have moved since the last election, the address on your registration will need to be updated to match the address on your drivers license.
- Ballots will be mailed 21 days before Election Day for both the Primary and General Elections.

NO DUMPING!... PLEASE!!!

Alpine City has a growing problem with people dumping old couches, TVs, trash, grass clippings, tree limbs, etc. in Lambert Park, vacant lots, and other areas of public open space. This creates blight, fire hazards, bad smells and a general nuisance. Please do not be someone who is part of this problem. It might seem harmless to some people to dump something that is "biodegradable" in an undeveloped natural area. It doesn't work out that way. If you do not own the property, don't dump in it! If you are dumping in open space or on a vacant lot, please stop!

If you need a way to dispose of your large items or green waste, you may pick up a FREE dump pass in the front office at City Hall. Each household will receive one free dump pass per calendar year. If you have already used your dump pass and you have more to dispose of, you may want to consider an additional garbage can (\$6.00 per month) OR you may take it to Dunn's Transfer Station located at 520 N. Geneva Road in Orem, Monday thru Friday from 7 am to 5 pm and Saturdays from 7 to 1 pm.

If you are not a part of this problem, thank you!!! If you see or know about someone dumping where they shouldn't, talk to them about it. Alpine City places great value in its open spaces. Please be a part of preserving and maintaining these wonderful assets to the community.

NOTE: Timpanogos Special Service District located west of Pleasant Grove (Exit 275 off I-15) typically takes green waste at no charge, but due to a fire, they are currently unable to process it until further notice.

Mayor seat	4-year term
Two City Council seats	4-year term

Candidate Filing period begins: June 1, 2017
Candidate Filing period ends: June 7, 2017

Qualifications for Candidacy are:

- Be a United States Citizen
- Be a registered voter of the municipality
- Be a resident of the municipality (or a recently annexed area) for a period of 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.
- Be mentally competent.
- Not be convicted of a felony or treason unless the right to hold office has been restored.

Declaration of Candidacy forms or Nomination Petitions must be filed in person with the City Recorder at Alpine City Hall, 20 North Main, Alpine, Utah Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 am to 5 pm beginning June 1, 2107 and ending June 7th. No applications taken on the weekend.

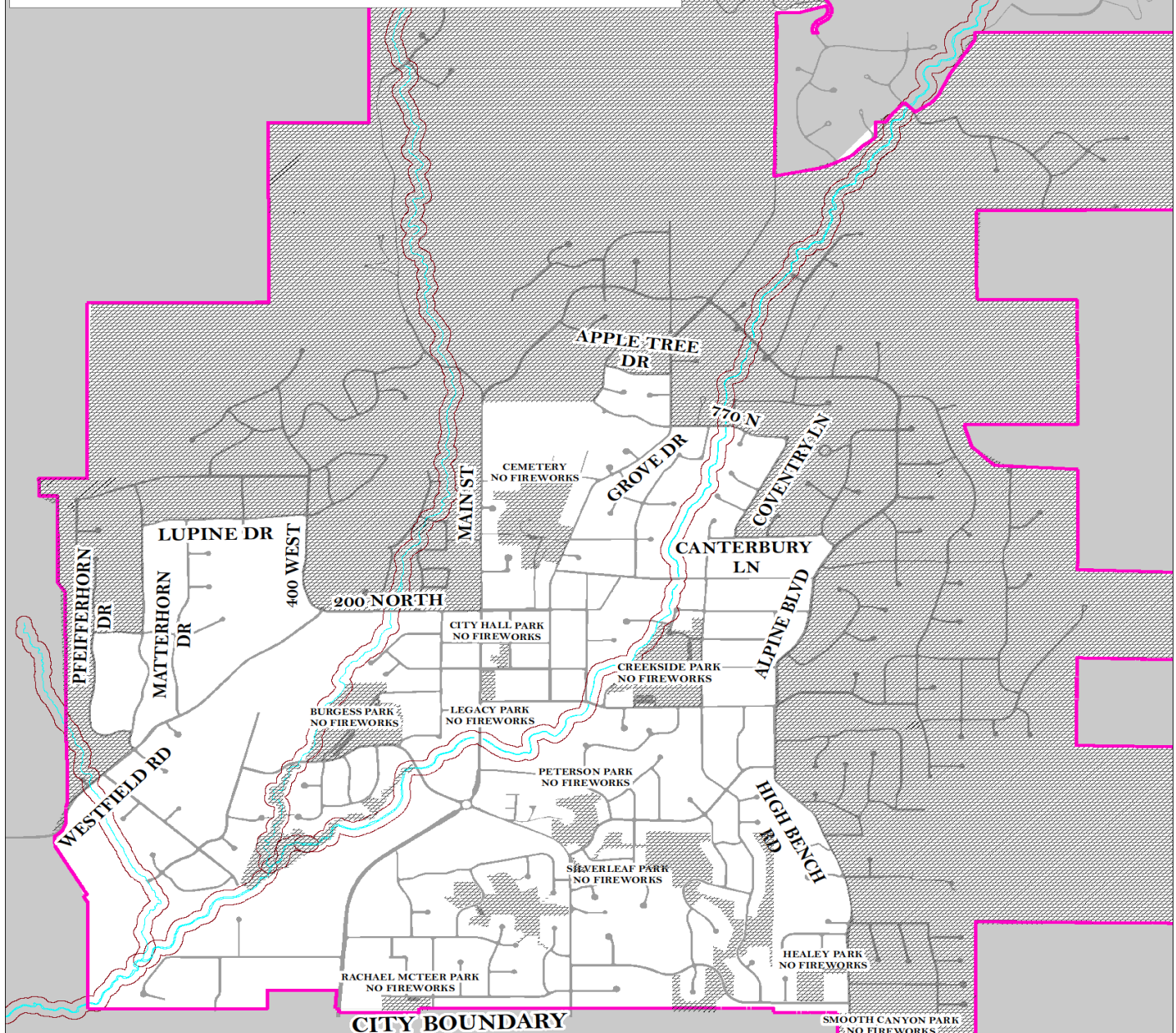
Jannicke and I have enjoyed serving in this capacity over the years and are sure that whoever takes over will feel the same great spirit and satisfaction we have enjoyed.
