RESOLUTION 2018.19

FLOODPLAIN MANAGER & TOQUERVILLE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR APPOINTMENT

WHEREAS, Toquerville City ("City") is an incorporated municipality duly organized under the laws of the State of Utah; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has directed the staff to utilize the resources of the City in an effective manner in the provision of emergency management; and

WHEREAS, certain areas of Toquerville City are subject to periodic flooding, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Council to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards, emergency disaster response and recovery assistance in all official actions relating to land use in areas having these hazards; and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to Utah State Code 10-9a-505(c) and the City's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, Toquerville City on March 26, 2009 adopted Chapter 11, Flood Damage Prevention with findings of facts, purpose and methods.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOQUERVILLE CITY COUNCIL, based upon the recitals set forth above that:

Floodplain Manager

- 1. Assures the Federal Emergency Management Agency that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force, in those areas having flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in Section 60 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and
- 2. Bests Floodplain Manager with the responsibility, authority and means to:
 - a. Assists the Administrator, at his/her request in the delineation of the limits of the area having special flood hazards.
 - b. Provide such information concerning present uses and occupancy of the floodplain, mudslide, (i.e. mudflow) or flood-related erosion areas as the Administrator may request.
 - c. Maintain for public inspection and furnish upon request for the determination of applicable flood insurance risk premium rates within all areas having special flood hazards identified on a Flood Hazard Boundary Map (FHBM) or Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), any certificates of floodproofing, and information on the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the level of the lowest flood (including basement) of all new construction or substantially improved structures, and include whether or not such structures contain a basement and if the structure has been floodproofed, the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was floodproofed.

- d. Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake a study, survey, map and identify floodplain mudslide (i.e., mudflow) or flood-related erosion areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow) and/or flood-related erosion areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
- e. Upon occurrence, notify the Administrator in writing whenever the boundaries of the community have been modified by annexation or the community has otherwise assumed or no longer has authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for a particular area. In order that all FHBM's and FIM's accurately represent the community's boundaries, include within such notification a copy of the map of the community suitable for reproduction, clearly delineating the new corporate limits or new area for which the community has assumed or relinquished floodplain management regulatory authority.
- f. Submit an annual report to the Administrator concerning the community's participation in the program, including, but not limited to the development and implementation of floodplain management measures.
- 3. Designates an Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) with the responsibility, authority and means to:
 - a. Complete and maintain the City's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP), along with all of its appendices.
 - b. Presents an updated CEMP to the City Council for acceptance by resolution annually.
 - c. Maintain the City's State and Federal National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliance (via the state and FEMA database).
 - d. Prepare, submit and manage emergency management program grants through the state and federal governments.
 - e. Provide a financial and budget materials as needed to the Executive, Finance and Budget departments.
 - f. Serve as the equipment and operations manager for the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC).
 - g. Provide training and exercises for employees at all levels in community emergency preparedness, emergency operations, response and recovery, including their own safety at home and at City facilities.
 - h. Manage the placement of emergency equipment and supplies in all occupied City facilities and provides training for occupants.
 - i. Identify and analyze the Risks and/or Hazards to the community and how the City responds in conjunction with the CEMP.
 - j. Serve as the liaison to Summit County Emergency Services, Utah State
 Department of Homeland Security, the Local Emergency Planning Committee
 (LEPC) and other jurisdictions on emergency management.

k. Respond and serve as the Emergency Manager as needed on local or regional events, including but not limited to, Incident Commander, EOC Manager, facilitator, liaison, logistics resource, debriefing and after-action coordinator.

1. Collaborate with the Community & Public Affairs Manager to work a community and citizen preparedness and training, along with business Corporate preparedness training.

- m. To serve as the Chair of the Emergency Management Group (EMG) and the City Building Security Committee
- 4. Appoints Floodplain Manager and Emergency Management Coordinator, Ryker Steglich with the responsibility, authority, and means to implement the commitments as outlined in this Resolution.
- 5. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objects of the adopted floodplain management and emergency management measures.

REPEALER. This resolution shall repeal and supersede all prior resolutions governing the same.

SAVINGS CLAUSE: If any provision or clause in this resolution or the application thereof to any person or entity or circumstance is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect other sections, provisions, clauses, or applications hereof which can be implemented without the invalid provision, clause, or application hereof, and to this end the provisions and clauses of this resolution are declared to be severable.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon approved by City Council.
