## Sonny acres fall festival 2020

When the trees start to change and there is a chill in the air, that's my signal is the Fall Festival time. Heading to Sonny Acres Farm for their pumpkins and fall festival is a tradition from when I was a kid that I'm happy to pass on to my kids. Sonny Acres Farm is under new management and promises to keep traditions alive while adding new features to make their fall festival bigger and better than ever! Carnival Rides are what separates the Sonny Acres Farm pumpkin patch from the others we have visited. Rides include a small train, car and motorcycle merry-go-round, flying elephants, pumpkin spider, fun house, giant slide, giant swings, jumping pillow, and more. The rides vary for different age groups. The train allows parents to ride with babies, while the giant swings are for older children. Ride tickets are purchased at checkouts, cash only, for \$1 per ticket. Typically rides were between 3-6 tickets. Attractions include a family-friendly daytime hayride, pony rides, camel rides, petting zoo coral with play equipment, petting zoo, ghost barn and nocturnal ghostly hayride. The nocturnal ghostly hayride is a popular attraction for high school students in the area. New this year is the bouncy castle! There is plenty of variety in attractions that a child by adults have options to enjoy. Attraction tickets must be purchased at a ticket booth for \$1 per ticket. For example, the hayride was 6 tickets per person. READFamily-Friendly Weekend Events: January 1-3 and BeyondFood and Stores at the Fall Festival have grown under new management. There are Halloween costume shops, sweet shops, a farm fresh market, and tons of pumpkins available to buy. The food vendors and trucks were a new addition this year. Standard festival food is available, such as hot dogs, burgers, fries, kettle corn, and funnel pies. Some new additions were beef sandwiches, grilled cheese, chicken tenders, apple cider doughnuts, roasted corn, and tacos. Some food vendors took tickets and some vendors were on a credit card or cash system. Every supplier was different. Bring a car or stroller for the little ones. There are some muddy areas while walking from the parking lots. There are wagons for rent for driving pumpkins, but not for children. If you are interested in the attractions and attractions, try to come on a Wednesday! Sonny Acres Farm offers a \$15 wristband from 2pm-6pm for unlimited attractions, pony rides, day/hooitente, bouncy castle, ghost barn and the improved Kiddie Koral. On Thursday, ladies receive 50% off the Haunted Barn admission from 7am Hours. Don't forget to bring cash to avoid ATM fees! The COVID-19 pandemic means that some of the Chicago pumpkin patches have had to adjust hours, prescriptions and activities as they head into the fall. But pumpkin picking - and other fun trap activities like apple orchards - can still happen with safety measures and social distancing in place. Fortunately, the coronavirus has only changed - not completely closed - your favorite pumpkin patches and their offerings this fall.
