The neat part is that you embed your story on blogs or share it with your friends and family. You also browse through other user stories. The features are almost identical to what you'll find on the iOS version, so there's no disparity. Google Play iTunes Bumble is a dating app that is brought to you by Whitney Wolfe, one of the co-founders of Tinder, and the primary focus is on making women the initiator. It works quite similar to Tinder in that it only connects people who have swiped right on each other's profiles. What's different is that the woman has to start the conversation within 24 hours before the connection is gone, and for same-sex connections, both people can start the conversation. Google Play iTunes Do you need a movie recommendation? Your friends know you best, so why don't you ask? That's what Tronko is all about. It's a messaging app built around your friends who recommend and discuss movies with each other. You start group messages or have a conversation with one person. The app picks up its data using the TMDb API, and you rate movies on a scale of 1 to 10. iTunes Google Play Selfie takers no longer have to rely on the front camera. Everyone knows the rear camera offers a higher quality photo, and Elie is an app that lets you point the reversing camera and take selfies without you having to do anything. It recognizes your face and takes multiple photos, but only beats the one you choose. It offers a variety of other features as well, such as adding effects while taking a photo, not after. Slide is a neat little little camera app for iOS that brings your photos to life. All you have to do is take a photo using the app while moving your device smoothly in a horizontal motion. Once the photo is taken, just tap the subject of the photo and watch it turn into a video or GIF, adding depth to the image, and really making it pop. The result is easy to share on Instagram, iMessage, Twitter, Facebook and other social media channels. The app will cost you \$1.99, and great for iPhone owners who can't use Apple's own Live Photos feature that's only on the iPhone 6S. The app provides secure unlimited photo backups in the cloud and retrieves photos stored on your phone and social media accounts. The free layer stores them at high resolution, but you need the premium version of the app to store them at full resolution. Photos are categorized by event, or you create your own albums, plus you invite others to upload their own photos. A similar feature has just been added to Google Photos. The premium version of Everalbum costs \$9.99 per month, with the option to have your favorite photos printed and sent to your home. Everalbum works in many languages such as English, German, Italian and Arabic. iTunes Windows digital assistant, Cortana, has officially come to Android and iOS. Built into windows phone and Windows 10 desktop, Cortana manages and displays your appointments, tracks packages, gives you your flight information and weather and more. You need a Microsoft account, and if you're already using a Windows 10 device, Cortana is now syncing your data to your smartphone. In the Android version, you can say Hey Cortana to access the voice assistant from the Home screen and also in the app. If you get a missed call, Cortana pushes it to your Windows 10 PC and texts you to the caller without having to answer your phone.
