Social Media Unit History/Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, The 1st Armored Division Artillery was first constituted on July 15, 1940, in the Regular Army as the Artillery Section, Headquarters, 1st Armored Division, and activated at Fort Knox, Kentucky. The unit was redesignated on November 15, 1940, as the Artillery Section, Division Base, 1st Armored Division. The unit was reorganized and redesignated on March 1, 1942, as Headquarters, Division Artillery Command, Headquarters, 1st Armored Division. During World War II, the Division Artillery Command fought in North Africa and Italy, gaining six campaign streamers. The unit was consolidated on July 20, 1944, with the Service Company, 1st Armored Division (minus Military Police Platoon) (which had first been established on January 1, 1942, in the Regular Army and activated on January 8, 1942, in Fort Knox, Kentucky), and the consolidated unit was reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters , Division Artillery, 1st Armored Division. The unit was inactivated on April 18, 1946, at the Port of Embarkation in New York, New York. On March 7, 1951, it was reactivated in Fort Hood, Texas. The unit was reorganized and redesignated on July 1, 1955, as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 1st Armored Division Artillery before being inactivated again on December 23, 1957, in Fort Polk, Louisiana. On February 3, 1962, the unit was reactivated in Fort Hood, Texas. In May 1971, the unit was inactivated at Fort Hood, Texas, and reactivated in Zindorf in place of ancient elements of the 4th Armored Division Artillery. On November 9, 1990, the Division Artillery was notified to leave for Saudi Arabia. As part of Desert Shield and Desert Storm operations, the 1st Armored Division Artillery added two additional battle streamers for service in the asia. In December 1995, the Division Artillery was sent to Bosnia and Herzegovina as part of the Eagle Task Force in support of Operation Joint Effort. In 1997, the Division Artillery was deployed to Operation Joint Guard and Joint Forge Operation. In 1998, the Division Artillery planned and executed Rolling Steel, the first large-scale maneuvering rights exercise in Germany since 1993. 1999 saw elements of the Division Artillery sent for peacekeeping operations with Operation Allied Force in Albania and Operation Joint Guardian in Kosovo. In the late 2000s, DIVARTY of the 1st Armored Division was inactivated. This was a product of the transformation of the 1st Armored Division into the new modular force structure. As part of the transformation, assets that were previously kept at the division level but usually linked to the division's brigades during operations were made organic for these brigades, including support for field artillery. The 2nd Battalion, 3rd Field Artillery was inactivated and reactivated as part of the reorganized and reassigned 1st Combat Brigade. The 4th Battalion, 27th Field Artillery was also reassigned to the reorganized and reassigned 2nd Combat Brigade. The 1st Battalion, 94th Field Artillery was inactivated, reorganized and reactivated as part of the 17th Fire Brigade at Fort Lewis, Washington. Page 2 The 1st Armored Division, nicknamed Old Ironsides, is the oldest and most recognizable armor division in the United States Army. As part of the Mechanization of the U.S. Army and the buildup to World War II, cavalry and reconnaissance units were assembled to form the 1st Armored Division, July 15, 1940, in Fort Knox, Kentucky. On May 11, 1942, the 1st Armored Division left the U.S. and five days later was training in Northern Ireland. On October 29, 1942, old ironsides moved to England to depart for North Africa. The first contact of the 1st Armored Division with an enemy was as part of the Allied invasion of North Africa. Operation Torch, November 8, 1942. The Allies received unexpected resistance from the Vichy-French units. Old Ironsides then advanced towards Tunisia. In January 1943, Old Ironsides, as part of the II Corps, was given the mission to defend central Tunisia against an Axis counterattack. After three months, the Allies could finally claim victory in North Africa. Old Ironsides then moved to Naples, Italy, October 28, 1943, to support the allied effort there. In June 1945, old ironsides moved to Germany as part of the occupying force. 1st Armored Division disabled, April 25, 1946. Nearly five years later, on March 7, 1951, the 1st Armored Division reactivated in Fort Hood, Texas. The 1st Armored Division moved to Germany in 1971, and was based in the city of Ansbach, West Germany. The division remained in Germany for the next 20 years as part of U.S. forces committed to a NATO defense of Europe. In from 1990, old ironsides sent 17,400 soldiers to Saudi Arabia in support of Operation Desert Shield. On February 24, 1991, the 1st Armored Division crossed into Iraq to begin Operation Operation Storm as the leading unit in the main attack of the VII Corps. The 1st Armored Division was deployed twice between 1995 and 1999. The first deployment in 1995 sent the Iron Soldiers to Bosnia and Herzegovina in support of Operation Joint Effort. Four years later, the 1st Armored Division was ordered to become part of Operation Allied Force in Albania and Operation Joint Guardian in Kosovo. On March 4, 2003, the 1st Armored Division was ordered to participate in the global war on terrorism. On April 15, the Iron Soldiers left to support Operation Iraqi Freedom. The Armored Division 1 Task Force was the largest division-based task force in U.S. Army history. Combat teams from the 1st Armored Division have been mobilized several times since 2003 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn and Operation Lasting Freedom. In 2005, the Base Realignment and Closure Commission determined that the 1st Armored Division should leave its bases in Germany and move to Fort Bliss, Texas. The division officially untied its colors at Fort Bliss, May 13, 2011. In June 2017, the 1st Headquarters of the Armored Division and the Division's Artillery Headquarters were deployed in support of Operation Inherent Resolve. The division's headquarters took command of the Joint Forces' Joint Ground Component Command and the coalition and Iraqi partner forces made enormous progress denying ISIS aspirations. During the nine months of deployment, the Combined Joint Forces Joint Components Joint Command, led by the 1st Armored Division, defeated insurgent counter-attacks, recovered thousands of square kilometers, and significantly weakened ISIS' terrorist infrastructure in Iraq. The CJFLCC helped define the conditions for the Government of Iraq to announce the liberation of Iraq from IS in December 2017.
