One of the most sought-after features of Facebook Messenger - group video calls - is finally being introduced via an update of the app. Up to six people can make video calls at the same time, but Facebook doesn't want to force everyone in a group to participate. As product manager Andrew Song told Digital Trends, not everyone is always video call-ready. We designed this experience with a view to mobile phones, Song said. The basic idea of Messenger Rooms is that you should be able to create a space for any activity or event you want to hold. They should be able to send people a link, and then they should be able to come by and hang out with you, he said during a live stream. On desktop devices, a Messenger Room session can accommodate up to 16 participants simultaneously in Zoom-like grids. On mobile devices, the number drops to eight. If it's too angled, you'll be able to tower over your fellow fighters. You want the lens to be at eye level. A tripod can take you there and keep the camera stable. If you're using the built-in camera on your laptop, it may be too low—and look up your nose. Although it's not ideal, you can put hardcover books under your laptop until the angle is right. You want the camera to capture the triangle of your forehead on your left and right shoulders in the frame.3. Look presentable. Even if only your face and shoulders are in the frame, you never know if you need to get up for any reason. So look decent from head to toe. Put some flattering, solid colors near your face, just like TV news anchors do. Check your teeth for leftovers from lunch. Make sure the temperature is such that you don't sweat, and don't have to start taking layers, which is worrying for all watching. Less obvious? Make sure you have the right chair, says Bailo. Fidgeting is fine on audio, but deadly if you can see someone moving like a hyperactive schoolboy in the corner of your screen.
