What to know about an online master in reading and literacy training The online master of reading usually does not lead to initial certification as a teacher. Rather, the degree provides current teachers in the classroom with advanced skills in reading and writing training. Most master's programs in reading focus on evaluating reading and supervision in the classroom, language arts and children's literature, diagnosing and dealing with reading difficulties. Some programs emphasize literature, while others explore different theories for reading pedagogy. This award is not a grant that needs funding. Instead, grant recipients must teach for at least four years in a high-need area at a low-income school and maintain 3.25 SOPs or more.
