\$20.00 for an intact dog

Proof of current rabies vaccination is required

Kennel Permit

If you have 3 or 4 dogs, a kennel permit is required.
(no more than 4 dogs are allowed)

- permit valid for 3 years
- cost to apply is \$55.00

1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.**



- Where no curb and gutter exists, a vehicle must be parked 6 feet off the asphalt.
- Equipment and trailers must be removed.

The parking ordinance applies during the entire 5 month period whether or not there is snow on the ground.

Go out of your way to help a neighbor! You could shovel snow, help with lights, or deliver a meal. Every act of kindness counts!

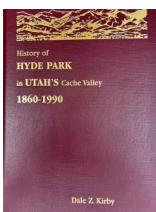
Business licenses - Time to renew
