### Message From Mayor Cox

It's hard to believe that March is upon us. We've had a great winter which brings us fantastic spring skiing. I hope that your family is enjoying our winter no matter the choice of fun.

Just a few updates of what we're working on as a city. As you may be aware, we received a grant (\$55k) to update our General Plan. This is now complete and on our city website. We're now in the process of updating our city codes to implement the General Plan. This will be on going for the next few months. We've also received a grant (\$1mil) to help drill a well. We've completed the hydrologist and geologist studies. We'll be moving forward on this in the spring. The last grant (\$31k) that I'll mention, creates our city Water Master Plan. This is almost complete and we'll be having it for review shortly.

Here at the city we've been working hard to get grants to help plan for our future and resolve some of our current issues. I've mentioned 3 grants but as a city we've received 9 total. We keep looking to do all we can to help our community. Have a great March.

### **Baseball/Fast Softball Sign-ups:**

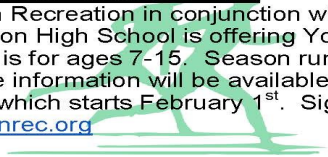

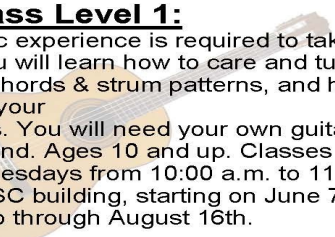


### **Play Music With Me Class:**

The objective for Play Music With Me classes is for parents/caregivers to have positive musical experiences with their infants and children, ages 0 to 5 years old, to encourage bonding and learning. Classes will be full of singing, chanting, movement and dance, playing rhythmic instruments, musical games, listening to, and exploring a variety of music. Classes will be held on Wednesdays from 11:30 a.m. to 12:15pm at the HSC building, starting on March 29<sup>th</sup>, and classes will go through May 17<sup>th</sup>.

### **Guitar Class Level 1:**

No prior music experience is required to take this class. You will learn how to care and tune your guitar, basic chords & strum patterns, and how to play some of your favorite songs. You will need your own guitar, book and music stand. Ages 10 and up. Classes will be held on Wednesdays from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the HSC building, starting on June 7<sup>th</sup>, and classes will go through August 16<sup>th</sup>.



### **Easter Egg Hunt**

The North Logan Easter Egg hunt is set for Saturday, **April 1<sup>st</sup>** and starts at **12:30p.m.** SHARP, at the south end of Elk Ridge Park by the grass and turf fields. This is for ages 0 to 8 years old.
