Message From Mayor

Summer has come and we couldn't be happier to be finished with the never-ending winter. I'm not going to complain, we've been blessed with abundant snow in the mountains which will continue to meet our needs this year. Even with the abundant snow, I wouldn't want us to revert to our wasteful ways with water. Continue forward, make changes in landscape usage and designs. Hyde Park City is the only municipality in the county that has been approved by the State of Utah to implement the state buyback program. We continue to meet with the emergency specialists and likely will for a couple more weeks. Because Hyde Park residents answered the call to prepare, we've been able to do so much. We not only filled 2,200 -2,500 sandbags, but residents also took action to clear debris so water could safely flow through the city ditches, canals, gutters and storm collection systems. We also inventoried our necessary resources in the event of emergency. Hyde Park has prepared a plan for action in the event of emergency. This allowed us to help our neighbors in the valley. Avon (Little Bear River) was close to going over the road. They asked Hyde Park to help them. They brought a flatbed trailer and we gave them 500 sandbags. Franklin Idaho also needed help, so 300-400 bags went there. A trailer park in Logan was flooding. We supplied them many empty bags and sand was donated. All the while, we knew we still had the resources to respond to emergencies in Hyde Park.

Well done people of Hyde Park. We talk about how much we love being in Hyde Park and the community feel that we don't want to lose as we grow and develop. It has nothing to do with the houses, neighborhoods, parks or trails, although they're wonderful. It has to do with the nature and goodness of the hearts and minds of the people that live here and call Hyde Park home. Thank you for helping your neighbors in this beautiful valley.

The Youth Council had such a fun closing social. We were able to have a pool party in the beautiful yard of Stephanie & Paul Merrill's home. We had a great time and good food. With burial records now all being stored "in the cloud," finding a gravesite for a loved one is as simple as scanning a QR code with your smart phone! Once the website (hydepark.cemsites.com) opens, simply type in the LAST and FIRST name of the individual's burial you are wishing to locate, and then follow the map to their gravesite. The Cemetery Bulletin Board has a posting of the guidelines for placing decorations on graves, along with the QR code to scan to locate a gravesite. PLEASE adhere to the guidelines, and remember that **"glass vases or any other breakable objects are not allowed on graves/headstones at any time."** We are grateful to be the caretakers of this sacred place. Summer Hoops Basketball Camps: Camps will be administered by current and former players and experienced coaches. Come have fun playing basketball with skill development, competitions and 5 on 5 games. The cost for each camp is \$75. Space will be limited. Each camper will also receive a camp t-shirt.

STEM Camp:** Learn more about engineering, math and science through hands-on learning. Children will experiment with things such as levitating cars, making solar ovens, making robotic hands, etc. There will

be four camps throughout the summer where they will be learning different things each time. Camps will be: June 5th-8th, June 19th-22nd, July 10th-14th, and July 17th-20th. Pick one or all of them! Each hour is a different grade so that the activity is tailored for that age group. Registration is now open. For grades Kindergarten through 5th. These camps will be taught by certified teachers.

On Wednesday, June 28th, we will host our very first practice and game and continue for seven weeks, every Wednesday night.
