In it, you'll find new first-party Xbox games like Gears 5 and Halo Infinite there the day they're released, plus classic gems from the original Xbox and Xbox 360 era. If those weren't enough to choose from now, Microsoft and EA now offer the full catalog of EA Play games in the service, with games like UFC 3, Dragon Age: Inquisition, FIFA 20 and more, at no additional cost. However, it's great that the service is a bit overwhelming for first-time users. The way the service is organized is not exactly conducive to finding the best games, or even the most popular ones. It's about just a mish-mash of games all released along with the new additions at the top. Therefore, instead of forcing you to delve into the catalog yourself, we have prepared a list of the best essential games of the service. Alien Isolation (Image Credit: SEGA)There are many places you can start on this list, but few are better than Alien: Isolation, a survival-horror game from Creative Assembly and SEGA that takes care of surviving an alien-infested ship. If you've always warned horror movie characters that they make an easily avoidable mistake that turns out to be fatal, this is your chance to prove you'd make the best first companion.2. ARK: Survival Evolved(Image Credit: Studio Wildcard)ARK Survival Evolved is Minecraft compliant with Jurassic - which, even on paper, sounds amazing. It's an action-adventure survival game that puts you on an island with basically nothing in your hand, and is tasked with building a base camp. De De you'll have to go out and capture the local wildlife - from dinosaurs and prehistoric mammals to straight monsters - and raise them. The only problem? It's all an open-world MMO, and you'll have other players to deal with too much.3. Batman: Arkham Knight (Image Credit: WB Games)We might be waiting a while for the next Batman movie with Robert Pattinson, but if you need your hooded crusader arrangement before that, check out Batman: Arkham Knight on Xbox Game Pass. The latest entry into Rocksteady's Batman trilogy also functions as a great standalone title as you put on your hood to prevent the entire Batman rogue gallery from taking over Gotham in what has to be the longest night in Batman's career. 4. Doom Eternal(Image credit: id Software)Having Eternal Doom on Xbox Game Pass only demonstrates how great the service is. This game came out in March 2020, and by October, it was already in service. Not only is it great that it's a recently released game, but Doom Eternal is actually one of the best shooters released this year. It's fast-paced and frantic, turning you against the hordes of Hell with nothing but a load of armor and artillery. A great one to unload if you're encouraged by the idea of bowing against an army of demons.5 Dragon Age: Inquisition(Image Credit: EA)Thanks to the recent partnership between EA and Microsoft, players can now get EA Play games as part of their Xbox Game Pass subscription at no additional cost. While EA Play brings a group of great new games to download, the one above the rest is Bioware's ambitious open-world RPG, Dragon Age: Inquisition. It was our Game of the Year in 2014 when it was released, and it still remains one of the best games of the last generation. If you missed it before, now's a good time to try. An MMO set in the world of Tamriel, The Elder Scrolls Online has selected you from one of three factions, aligned by their geographical locations around the world. Within your faction you will form guilds to fight each other and search the confines of the vast game world of Bethesda, all without paying a monthly fee. 7. Forza Horizon 4(Image Credit: Microsoft Studios)Forza has always been Xbox bread and butter when it comes to racing games, but Forza Horizon 4 really transcends the genre with its extensive open English field environment and changing seasons that alter the way cars drive through the game. While this game is great as a Solo, it's even better when you have friends playing just as you'll see their drivatars appear in races next to you. 8. Gears 5(Image Credit: The Coalition)One of the best parts about Xbox Game Pass is first-party games newly released for free at launch, such as Gears 5. This game not only has a fantastic single player story that follows the events of Gears of War 4, but also has a large number of great multiplayer modes available as part of the pack. 9. Gears Tactics turns the traditional third-person shooter franchise into your head with an exaggerated, bird's eye view of the battlefield. Tactics still has you leading Gears against the Locust invasion, but this time it's all turn-based combat with specialized soldiers who take various roles as a sniper, melee or doctor. Missions often follow a similar formula that can crawl a little towards the end of the game, but otherwise Gears Tactics is a fun way to immerse yourself in the franchise tradition without spending hours looking down in the sights of a lancer.9. Halo: The Master Chief Collection (Image Credit: 343 Industries)While Gears 5 and Ori take the best billing as the best exclusive Xbox One games on Xbox Game Pass, Halo: The Master Chief Collection comes in a very close third. If you haven't heard of it, it's basically the discography of the Halo universe, filled with Halo: Combat Evolved Anniversary, and the anniversary edition of Halo 2, Halo 3, and Halo 4. The collection includes all those games and all multiplayer maps. It's basically the best thing that can happen to any Halo fan. 10. Kingdom Hearts 3 (Image Credit: Square Enix)It took years to finally launch, but Kingdom Hearts 3 was worth the wait. The story is a little slow and slightly convoluted for newcomers to the series, but once you've passed the introduction you'll find a charming, action-packed adventure that we call the fantastic nature of Final Fantasy with Disney's magical familiarity in worlds that are almost indistinguishable from the movies they represent. Yes, it's so good.11 Mass Effect 2(Image Credit: EA/Bioware)Yes, Mass Effect 2 was released a decade ago, but that doesn't stop it from not only being the best game in the series, but one of the best games of the last decade. With branched story paths, cute characters you'll spend too much time trying to seduce, and pretty deep RPG mechanics that let you customize the way your characters work in battle, Mass Effect works in a number of levels. You may not have the graphic polishing of something like Mass Effect Andromeda, but with a better frame and more to explore, it's worth the space on your hard drive.12. Monster Hunter World (Image credit: Capcom)At one point a niche franchise here in the west, Monster Hunter has finally gotten its reappearance with the Monster Hunter World. This RPG franchise about monster hunting sounds a bit childish, but fast and frantic gameplay and gear routine make an extremely satisfying game that can alone or shared in the company of friends. You can't be wrong anyway. 13. Ori and the Will of the Wisps (Image Credit: Microsoft Game Studios)For years, Ori and the Blind Forest was one of our favorite Metroidvania 2D dungeon trackers on Xbox One - it was sincere, beautiful and challenging, and the world simply oozed personality and intrigue. Years later, Moon Studios and Microsoft have released Ori and the Will of the Wisps, a sequel that adds some new combat elements as a shard system that allows for greater customization of Ori's abilities, and great boss battles that make it more memorable and break puzzle solving. 14. Outer Wilds (Image Credit: Microsoft)What if I only had 22 minutes to live? What could you learn at that time, and if you were given 22 more minutes, what would you do with that time? This philosophical dilemma is tested in the action-adventure-exploration game Outer Wilds that makes you task to learn as much about the pint-sized universe as you can in 22 minutes. At that moment the sun will become supernova and you will have to start over, this time a little smarter and more seasoned than you were before.15 The Outer Worlds from developers Obsidian Entertainment takes everything you loved about the Fallout franchise - the humor, the writing and the arsenal - and brings it to the wider universe. What follows is a crazy and satire-rich role-playing game that injects a lot of fun into the classic Fallout formula we've come to love. 16. Overcooked 2 (Image Credit: Team17 Digital Limited,)If you need a fun multiplayer game in the blink of an eye, collect Overcooked 2 on Xbox Game Pass. This cooperative cooking game saddles you up with other players to try to operate a restaurant kitchen efficiently, fulfilling orders as they get off customers. It sounds easy, but things get tough when parts of the kitchen move or malfunction randomly - the comfort and nonsense of it all, however, are well worth any irritation you may experience. 17. Rage 2 (Image Credit: Avalanche)Rage 2 was not the most well-received game when it was released in 2019, but it is still a fun (and fast) first-person shooting game that is only freely linked to the original 2011. What you can expect is a Mad Max-like experience that pits you against the wasteful and super mutants as you make your way through the wastelands. 18. Rainbow Six: Siege(Image Credit: Ubisoft)Fans of first-person shooters might be upset that there is no Call of Duty game on Xbox Game Pass, but between the Battlefield series and the featured first-person shooter Ubisoft, Rainbow Six: Siege, there are many other options. What we like most about Siege is that it depends less on twitch's ability, and more on tactical planning. Where you put explosive charges, how you cover corners and when you move you move rooms all matter, and are decisions like the ones that give the game a high skill limit. Sea of Thieves The Rare'sswashbuckling Sea of Thieves adventure allows you to take on the role of a pirate navigating the seas of a fantastic world, either alone or as part of a crew of up to four members. It is up to you whether you choose to focus on trading, treasure hunting or looting others. This is a great title for those who enjoy playing with others in an open world environment with a pirate-themed touch. 21. Kill the Spire (Image Credit: Mega Crit Games)For strategy fans, Slay the Spire is like Magic: The Gathering meets Spelunky. This rogue deck builder has you modifying a deck so it went all the way to the top of the needle. As you make your way to the top of the tower, you'll have to make decisions about which cards to improve, what potions to stock, and what relics to take, all of which can be the difference between life and death in a boss battle. If you like mind-blowing card fighters, Slay the Spire is worth the disk space. 22. Tekken 7 (Image Credit: Bandai Namco)While there are a number of great fighting games in the service, Tekken 7 is easily the most polished of the group now that it has had two years to solve the problems. A 3D fighter with a two-decade pedigree, the Tekken franchise makes some significant advances with the tenth inning of the series that adds rage arts and power hits to the mix, creating closer and more intense matches between players of different skill levels.23 Tetris Effect: ConnectedFor its time, Tetris was a masterpiece. It was the perfect mix of addictive gameplay, torque logic and, at the final levels, a quick reflex test. But what if Tetris could be more than that? What if it could be an emotional - or even spiritual - journey? It's Tetris effect. A twist on the old game that combines beautiful backdrops, evocative music and ever-increasing speeds to get you in the perfect flow state.
