Select Advanced.

Hit Phone Ringtone. Go to My Sounds.

If your ringtone doesn't show up, press the button in the bottom right corner. Find the song and press it. Hit Save.

Set music ringtone in older devices: Download or transfer the song you want to set as your ringtone to your phone. Using a file manager app, move your song to the Ringtones folder. If you've connected your device to a computer via USB, you'll be asked how you want that connection to be managed, so choose to explore files and folders. This will make your phone's storage look and work like any other folder in your PC, so you simply copy and paste the file directly into the Ringtones folder. Go to File - Import - Audio.

Find and select the ringtone's song. Use the selection tool and cursor to highlight the part of the audio you want to keep as your music rings. Once a section has been selected, you can tap Space to play only that role and make sure you like it. Now click Edit and delete audio trim. Only the section you've selected will remain. Tap F5 to activate the Time Shift tool and drag your audio to the beginning of the timeline. I would also like advice using the Fade In and Fade Out at the beginning and end. Tap on the Trim Audio option. Select the song you want to turn into a phone ringtone. Swipe the cursors to select the part of the song you want to keep as a ringtone. Green is the beginning and red at the end. You can use the media controls at the bottom to get a preview. Press the floppy icon at the top right. Select a name for the new file. Hit it well. Now follow the tutorial in the previous section to turn it into a phone ringtone. How to cut music using a website editor: You may not even need specialized software! There are many online tools that can do the job. One of them mp3cut.net, and the process is super simple too. Open your browser of choice and go to mp3cut.net.

Select the Choose File button. Find and select the song file you want to cut. Let the site work its magic for a bit. Use the left and right sliders to select the area you want to keep as the phone ringtone. Choose whether you want to fade in or out. Also

select the duration of your fade. Hit Cut.Select file to your phone. Follow the steps of the first section of this article to define the audio as your ringing song.
