A trophy is a sculpture of a football shoe. Since its inception in the 1967/68 season, the award, originally called Soulier d'Or, which translates from French as the Golden Boot or Boot, has been awarded to the top scorer in all European leagues during the season. Since 1997, it has been calculated using weight in favor of the highest ranked leagues. Originally presented by L'Équipe magazine, it has been featured by European Sports Media since the 1996/97 season. Lionel Messi holds the record under 6 times. History Between 1968 and 1991, the award was awarded to the highest scorer in any European league. This was regardless of the strength of the league in which the king of scorers played and the number of matches in which the player participated. During this period Eusébio, Gerd Müller, Dudu Georgescu and Fernando Gomes won the Golden Boot twice. [1] After a protest from the Cyprus FA, who claimed that a Cypriot player with 40 goals should receive the award (although the official top scorers of the season are listed with 19 goals), L'Équipe did not issue any awards between 1991 and 1996. Since the 1996/97 season, European Sports Media have awarded the Golden Boot based on a points system that allows players in more difficult leagues to win, even if they score fewer goals than a player in a weaker league. The weights are determined by the league's ranking on UEFA coefficients, which in turn depend on the performance of each league of clubs in European competitions over the past five seasons. Goals scored in the top five leagues according to the UEFA coefficient list are multiplied by a factor of two, goals scored in leagues ranked from six to 21 are multiplied by a factor of 1.5, and goals scored in divisions classified 22 and below are multiplied by a factor of 1. [2] As a result, goals scored in the higher leagues will count more than those scored in the weaker Since that change, there have been only two winners who have not played in one of the top five leagues (Henrik Larsson, the 2000-01 Scottish Premier League and Mario Jardel, the 1998-99 Primeira Divisão and the 2001-02 Primeira Liga). Although the Golden Boot may have been shared among many players in the past, in the 2019/20 season this rule has been changed to give the player the least minute if there is a draw on points. The winner was Lionel Messi, who won the title six times. In the 2011/2012 season he scored the most goals and scored the most points in a single season (50 and 100, respectively). Eusébio was the first winner of the award in 1968. Gerd Müller was the first player to win the award twice, in 1970 and 1972. Ciro Immobile Lazio Serie A 36 72 Notes ^ Original 1986/87 season winner Rodion Cămătaru (with 44 goals) was disqualified later and the trophy was awarded to Polster in 1990. However, Cămătaru could keep his copy of the trophy. In the 1990/1991 season Darko Pančev won the award for the 1990/91 season, only in 2006.[6] after a protest from Cyprus, where the player reportedly scored 40 goals (although the official top scorers of the season, Suad Beširević and Panayiotis Xiourouppas, are listed with 19 goals). Because of this scandal, France Football decided to make the competition unofficial. Statistics Lionel Messi is the only player to have won the award six times, all against Barcelona. Messi holds the all-time record in one season with 50 in the 2011/2012 season, which amassed a record 100 points. In 1969-70 and 1971-72 he was the first Bayern Munich player to win the award. Messi was the first player to win the award three times, Cristiano Ronaldo was the first player to win the award four times, and Messi was again the first, and so far only, player to have won it five and six times. Only Lionel Messi (2016-17, 2017-18, 2018/19) has won the award for three years in a row. Thierry Henry (2003-04, 2004-05), Lionel Messi (2011-12, 2012-13 and 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19), Cristiano Ronaldo (2013-14, 2014-15) and Ally McCoist (1991-92, 1992-93) won the award in subsequent years. Diego Forlán (Villarreal, Atlético Madrid), Luis Suárez (Liverpool, Barcelona), Mário Jardel (Porto, Sporting CP) and Cristiano Ronaldo (Manchester United, Real Madrid) are the only players to win the award with two clubs.
