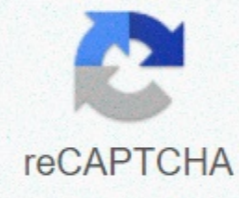

If you like the video, press the thumbs up button and subscribe to my channel. Material: Glass pyramid, artificial turf, piece of wood, dry branches, thermocol balls. This is my first instructable and I will show you how to make a small mini golf course. You can create additional courses and connect them. Put together four jumbo popsicle sticks and cut two more to fit the length of the four sticks. Then stick the two cut sticks onto the four sticks. Now you get two jumbo popsicle sticks and stick them on the long sides of your base made in step 1. Then cut a popsicle stick to fit the back of your base. Glue it to your back. Now cut a piece of thin, soft material to fit the inside of your base. I use a thin sheet of Eva foam, but you can also use cardboard. You then cut a hole where you want to go the ball in. Now you need to cut a piece of felt to fit your Eva foam/cardboard sheet. Glue them together and then glue them to your base. Now you can make the obstacles. BE CREATIVE! I cut two jumbo popsicle sticks and glued them together. I did this twice and glued it to the base in a diagonal position. As for the golf club, I got a toothpick and put the thin Eva foam on the floor. The foam was cut into two golf club shapes. Thanks for the observation, Podem The driver is one of the standard golf clubs worn by most golfers, but it also bears another name, one that has not become standardized over time: 1 wood. Yes, a driver and a 1-wood are the same golf club. Today, it is unusual for golfers to refer to their driver as their 1-wood; Go far enough in golf history, though, and it was a much more common thing. As an example, consider Craig Wood. Wood was a prominent Pga Tour golfer from the 1920s to the 1940s. He was a at the time, and his fellow pros called him 1-Wood. Because he smashed his driver so far, he became Craig One Wood: There goes ol' 1-Wood! 1-wood is a different name for the driver, although it was used more often in earlier times. While most drivers made today still print the number 1 on their soles, not everyone does, and the use of the club loft in addition or instead of the 1 also occurs. The numbering of golf clubs dates back to the 1920s and gained real notoriety in the 1930s. Before there were no golf clubs called 5-iron or the 3-wood or the 9-iron. Before the advent of matched sets, golf clubs had names. But when the matching sets arrived and began to take over golf in the 1930s, they arrived with the names of clubs (names like niblick and mashie) that were replaced by numbers (such as 3-iron, 4-iron, etc.). The woods, a category that includes the driver plus fairway wood, were also numbered. The driver was given the number one, followed by fairway woods such as the 2-wood, 3-wood, 4-wood and so on. Look into a golf bag today and you'll still see these numbers on the soles of golf clubs. These numbers make it easy for a golfer looking into their pocket to identify a club they want. And when numbered sets became the norm in golf, the number 1 appeared on the soles of the riders. Therefore, the driver became known as 1-wood. Today, most drivers still have the 1 printed on the bottom. In some cases it may be in a smaller type than the height angle of the club; In some cases, the 1 may not appear at all, with only the number for the survey angle displayed. But most drivers still have these 1 printed on their soles. How do golfers use the driver? The 1 wood is the longest - both in terms of the actual length of the club, from the top of the shaft to the bottom of the clubhead, and the distance it plays - club in the golf bag. As such, it was used almost exclusively for playing the golf ball from the tee area at the beginning of the golf holes. You can use the driver for any shot you want (e.B. when you hit the driver from the deck). But most golfers use it exclusively from the tee on a hole long enough to need a good belt of the ball on the fairway. Since the driver is the longest-waved club and (outside the putter) has the lowest amount of loft, it is often the club that is the most difficult to use for amateurs and recreational golfers. In fact, most golf instructors advise professionals to give up the 1-wood in favor of a 3-wood or 5-wood (or hybrid) to improve the starting angle and gain better control over the shooting direction. Shortest course: At the second US Open in 1896, Shinnecock Hills was only 4,423 yards. This is an unbreakable record! But in the post-World War II period, Merion measured 6,544 yards for the 1971 and 1981 Opens.Longest par-3 hole: Oakmont's No. 8 played 300 yards during the fourth round in 2007.Shortest par-3 hole: Pebble Beach's No. 7 played 92 yards during the fourth round in 2010.Longest par-4 hole: The 13th hole at Chambers Bay was 551 yards during the second round in 2015.Shortest par-4 hole The 7th hole at the Olympic Club played 256 yards in the first round in 2012.Longest par-5 hole: Oakmont's 12th hole was 684 yards for the first round in 2016.Shortest par-5 hole: The No. 9 hole in Oakmont played 474 yards in the 1994 Open.
