# Item: A. Ordinance 23-501 Animal Control Update ORDINANCE NO. 23-501

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RUPERT, AMENDING RUPERT CODE TITLE 8 CHAPTER 3, PROVIDING FOR SEIZURE AND IMPOUNDING OF DOGS, PROVIDING INFRACTION FOR UNCONTROLLED DOGS, MISDEMEANOR FOR DANGEROUS AND AT-RISK DOGS, REQUIRING AND DEFINING SECURE ENCLOSURE OF DANGEROUS AND AT-RISK DOGS, PERMITTING COURT ORDER FOR DESTRUCTION OF DOGS.
