Doom Eternal (Image Credit: id Software)Having Doom Eternal on an Xbox Game Pass just proves how great value the service really is. This game came out in March 2020, and by October it was already in service. Not only is it cool that this recently released game, but Doom Eternal is actually one of the better shooters released this year. It's fast and frantic, putting you in front of a hell of a crowd with nothing but a butt load of armor and artillery. Dragon Age: Inquisition (Video Credit: EA)Due to a recent partnership between EA and Microsoft, players can now get EA Play games as part of their Xbox Game Pass subscriptions at no extra cost. While EA Play brings many great new games to download, one that stands above the rest of the bioware's ambitious open-world RPG, Dragon Age: The Inquisition. It was our game of the year back in 2014, when it was released, and it still has one of the best games of the last generation. If you missed it before, now as good as any give it a shot. Forza Horizon 4 (Image Credit: Microsoft Studios)Forza has always been xbox bread and butter when it comes to racing games, but Forza Horizon 4 really transcends the genre with its extensive open English rural setting and changing seasons that change the way cars handle the game. While this game is great as a solo experience, it's even better when you have friends to play, you'll also see their drivatars appear in the race along with you. 8. Gears 5 (Image Credit: Coalition)One of the best parts on the Xbox Game Pass is Newly released first party games free to start - such as Gears 5. This game not only has a fantastic single-player history that tracks gears of war 4 events, but also has many great multiplayer modes, which are also part of the package. 9. Gears Tactics (Image Credit: Microsoft)Gears Tactics turns the traditional third-person shooter franchise on its head with an over-the-top, bird-eyed view of the battlefield. Tactics still have leading gears against locust invasion, but this time it's all in turn based on fighting specialized soldiers taking on various roles like a sniper, melee unit or medic. Missions usually follow a similar formula that can slightly drag on the end of the game, but otherwise Gears Tactics is an interesting way to immerse yourself in the franchise lore, without spending hours looking at lancero sights.9. Halo: Master Chief Collection (Image Credit: 343 Industries)While Gears 5 and Ori take top billing as the best Xbox One exclusive games for Xbox Game Pass, Halo: Master Chief Collection comes very close to third. If you haven't heard of it, it's basically a halo universe schoolgirl, full of Halo: Combat Evolved Anniversary, and the anniversary edition of Halo 2, Halo 3 and Halo 4. The collection includes all these games and all multiplayer maps. It's basically the best thing to happen to any Halo fan ever. 10. Kingdom of Hearts 3 (Image credit: Square Enix)It took years to finally release, but Kingdom Of Hearts 3 was worth the wait. The story is a bit slow and a little convoluted in the newcomer series, but when you're past the introduction you'll find a charming and action-packed adventure that we've called the fantastic character of Final Fantasy with magical familiar Disney worlds that are almost devoted to the films they portray. yes, that's good.11. Mass Effect 2 (Image credit: EA/Bioware)Yes, Mass Effect 2 was released a decade ago, but that doesn't stop it being not only the best game in the series, but one of the best games of the last decade. With branching story paths, favorite characters that you spend way too much time trying to siping and pretty deep RPG mechanics that allow you to customize how your characters work in battle, massive effect works on a number of levels. It may have a graphic polish of something like Mass Effect Andromeda, but better plot and more explore, it's worth the space on your hard drive.12. Monster Hunter World (Image Credit: Capcom)At one point in a very niche franchise here in the West, Monster Hunter has finally gained its comeuppance with the critically acclaimed Monster Hunter World. This RPG franchise about hunting monsters sounds a bit childish, but fast, frenetic game and gear grinding make for a very satisfying game that can either taken separately or shared by a friends' company. In any case, you can not go wrong. 13. Ori and Wisps (Image Credit: Microsoft Game Studios) for 10 years, Ori and Blind Forest were one of our favorite Metroidvania 2D underworld scanners for xbox one – it was sincere, beautiful and complex, and the world just oozed personality and intrigue. For years, Moon Studios and Microsoft have released Ori and Wisps Will, a sequel that adds some new combat elements, such as the shard system, which allows for more customizable Ori abilities, and a big bass battle that makes it a more memorable and break down puzzle solution. 14. Outer Wilds (Image Credit: Microsoft)What if you only had 22 minutes to live? What could you know in the meantime and if you were given another 22 minutes, what would you do with that time? This philosophical quandary is presented in an attempt at action adventure exploration game Outer Wilds that tasks you to learn as much about the pint-sized universe as you can in 22 minutes. At that time, the sun will go supernova and you will have to start all over again – this time only a little smarter and more experienced than you were before.15. Overcooked 2 (Image credit: Team17 Digital Limited)If you need a pinch of fun multiplayer game, pick up Overcooked 2 Xbox Game Pass. This collaborative cooking game saddles you with other players to try and manage the restaurant kitchen effectively, fulfilling orders as they come down from customers. It sounds easy, but things become complicated when part of the kitchen move or malfunction randomly – deception and sillines of all this, though, is worth any and all the irritation you may experience. 17. Rage 2 (video credit: Avalanche) Rage 2 wasn't the most well-received game when it was launched in 2019, but it is still an interesting (and fast) first-person shooter that is loosely tied only to the original in 2011. What you can expect is Mad Max as an experience that pits you against wastelands and super mutants as you bust your way through the badlands. 18. Rainbow Six: Siege (Image credit: Ubisoft) Fans of first-person shooters can be bummed that there are no

What we most like about the siege is that it relies less on jerking skills, and more on tactical planning. It's a great name for those who love to play with other open world environments with a pirate-themed twist. 21. Slay Spire (Image credit: Mega Crit Games)Strategy fans, Slay Spire is like Magic: Collection meets Spelunky. This dishonest as a deck builder let you change deck to work your way to the top of the spire. As you fight your way to the top of the tower you will have to make decisions which cards to upgrade, which potions to stocks and which relics to take, all of which can be the difference between life and death in the boss battle. If you like mind-bending cards in battle, Slay Spire is worth the disk space. 22.
