[2], known as Rich Brian and formerly known as Rich Chigga, is an Indonesian rapper, singer, songwriter and music producer. He is known for his viral debut single Data \$tück, which was first released in March 2016 on SoundCloud. [4] The single was later certified raa gold. His debut studio album, Amen, was released in February 2018 and culminated in the 18th [6] Brian's second studio album, The Sailor, was released on August 26, 2020, and he released an EP titled 1999. [8] [9] Brian collaborated with many k-pop artists such as Kris Wu, Chung Ha, Keith Ape, Jae Park and Jackson Wang. Brian Imanuel Soewarno was born in Jakarta, Indonesia and is of ethnicAlly Sino-Indonesian descent. He is the youngest of four siblings. [12] Brian grew up in West Jakarta, a middle- to low-middle-class neighborhood. [13] Although his father was a lawyer,[14] he never had a formal education and spent most of his time helping out in his parents' café while he was being schooled at home. In 2010, growing up in Indonesia, he began his career on social media when he was 11 years old. That's how he discovered YouTube. He also found and joined Twitter in August 2010 when he was just 11 years old. This eventually led him to create video content, including a sketch of dark comedy on Twitter. At the age of 15, he moved to the Vine platform and began posting videos there. Brian, who at the time spoke only Indonesian, learned to speak English by watching YouTube videos and listening to rappers like Childish Gambino, 2 Chainz, Macklemore and Tyler, creator. [16] Brian began listening to hip hop music in 2012, when an American friend he knew online introduced him to Macklemore & Ryan Lewis thrift shop[17] and Brian began to explore deeper into the genre, discovering Drake, 2 Chainz, Kanye West and Logic. Brian wrote his first rap song in 2014 and recorded it into an iPhone microphone via MF DOOM made instrumental. [18] Brian originally wanted to become a cameraman in Los Angeles, giving up as soon as his music career took off. [19] Career 2015–16: Career beginnings Brian began his career under the name Rich Chigga and released his debut song called Living 17, 2015 on his YouTube account. The song was produced by DJ Smokey. On March 11, 2016, he released his debut single Dat \$tück. [21] [22] The track achieved international success after the release of reaction video 88rising, which features American rappers Ghostface Killah, 21 Savage, Tory Lanez, MadeinTYO, Designer and many others. [23] Since the official music video for the song was uploaded to his YouTube account, it has been viewed more than 139 million times. Dat \$tück then went to the top at number four on Bubbling Under R&amp;amp; B/ Hip-Hop Singles. On August 9, 2016, he released his second single, Who That Be, on iTunes. The song was produced by Sihk. He then released a remix of his debut single Dat \$tück, which features rappers Ghostface Killah and Pouya. [26] Brian later released his third single, Seventeen, which quickly surpassed the 1 million hit mark on both YouTube and SoundCloud. [27] 2017–2018: Amen Brian released his fourth single Back At It 19. He later began his first US tour in April 2017, which ended in May. In May 2017 he released the single Gospel with XXXTentacion and Keith Ape. [31] This was XXXTentacion's first collaboration with Brian and the song has been released over 88rising and has since received more than 38 million views on YouTube since its release. In May 2017, he won the award at the 4th Indonesian Choice Awards as Breakthrough Artist of the Year. Brian announced his debut album in an interview with XXL, saying: 'I'm working on a debut project and there are some serious songs and some comedic stuff, but serious songs are my focus. [34] In an interview, Brian said he spends most of his stay in Los Angeles, California working on his debut album. On August 15, 2017, Glow Like Dat released via YouTube channel 88rising. On September 9, he announced a nationwide come to my party tour. [37] Brian later released the singles Chaos and Crisis with 21 Savage in October and November 2017. [38] On December 19, 2017, Brian announced on twitter that he was releasing his debut studio album, Amen. On January 1, 2018, Brian officially changed his stage name from Rich Chigg to Brian with the release of See Me. Six days later, he changed his stage name to Rich Brian again. Brian later went on to appear in a single and musical video with Kris Wu, Joi, Trippie Redd and Baauer titled 18 on 15 January. On February 2, he was released and became the first Asian musician to top the iTunes Hip Hop charts, peaking at 18th on the US Billboard 200. [42] [43] After the release of Amen, Brian released Watch Out! 4 April 2018. [44] Later appeared 88rising is a compilation album. Head in the Clouds and released two singles to promote the album with Midsummer Madness featuring Joi, Higher Brothers, Kyle Chan, on August 8, and History was released on June 7 and July 18 respectively [45] On July 20, 2018 the album was released. On June 26, 2019, Brian released a new single called Yellow, starring artist and producer Bekon, and later announced his second studio album, The Sailor. On July 17, 2019, he released his second single from the album Kids. It was released by RZA and Joi on July 26, 2019. [50] [51] on 25 August 2020 he released an EP entitled 1999. The seven-track EP was preceded by three singles with accompanying video clips: Don't Care, Love in my Pocket and DOA[53]. [54] Rich Brian's musical style was called the ironic UrbanDaddy, though it eventually transcends itself to become a legitimate work of art. [56] Brian's vocals were described as baritone.[57] and his delivery as grumpy but agile[19] and unique. [58] His ability to write songs was called skillful by HotNewHipHop. [59] Brian, originally a comedic music writer, has since attempted to distance himself and make more serious music with singles such as Seventeen and Glow Like Dat. In an interview with Complex Magazine, he says that his album The Sailor is an important step forward for his art and he is starting to write about things that are deeply personal to him. [61] Brian cited Young Thug, Tyler, The Creator, Yung Lean and Childish Gambino as inspiration. [19] Brian's personal life currently lives in Los Angeles, California, after moving there in May 2017. [62] He is not a permanent resident of the United States; although in July 2017, he extended his stay. [35] Brian's original stage name, Rich Chigga, has sparked controversy in the past. [63] Brian and his friend came up with a nickname when he came out with his first song on SoundCloud. I realized I don't have a rap name. And then my friend from Wichita talked about it. We came up with a few names that were great, and he was like, 'Rich Chigga.' And that's honestly it. Speaking about his stage name, Brian said: 'I regret it - I didn't know what I was doing, and I certainly didn't know people were going to get going like that. From 2018, he became professionally known as Rich Brian. In a Twitter post, Brian said: I was planning to do it forever and I'm so happy to finally do it. I was naïve and I made a mistake.
