Of the nearly one million apps on the iPhone App Store which is the app that every new iPhone owner really needs? Which one helps you the most with your work, your hobbies, your responsibilities, and your pleasure? Of all the apps, are you worth paying attention to? Which one is the best? In short - this. Based on years of experience and countless tests and comparisons, these are the apps and games that we consider we should have and recommend you download now. This is the best app for iPhone. To paraphrase Peter Griffin, the make-a-da world go round app, and what's the point of having an iPhone if you're not going to load it with an interesting and useful app? Free apps are the best, but sometimes you can't get the features or fun you're looking for without spending a little dough. Here are the best paid apps for iPhone! My criteria for applications in this list Because it is the best paid app for the iPhone, I decided to include apps that you have to pay in advance or apps that may be free to download, but subscriptions are required or their functionality is greatly improved by making in-app purchases or by purchasing paid versions. I also omitted an iOS app that might actually be amazing, but more suitable for iPad (musical instrument apps, writing apps, etc.). This is it! Plex is OK, so we started with an app that you actually don't have to pay to download, but it's better if you pay to use it, make it a paid app in my eyes, and easily one of the best around. Plex media servers are a way for you to enjoy all your home media without having to be constantly plugged into your hard drive. You just need free Plex software on your computer and then applications, and you can enjoy all your favorite movies, TV shows, music videos, whatever, from all your devices – all you need is an internet connection. The beauty of the Plex is just that - it's elegant. The app organizes all your media for you and even adds rich descriptions, works and more, it gives it all a full and finished feel (unlike your first iPod Touch where you can't be bothered to find album artwork, so you only have thousands of songs passed on a white background featuring the eighth note). A paid Plex Pass allows you to upload more content to your server; you; trailers and extras for movies in your library (special features and what not); setting up a Plex Home for your family (which allows you to switch between accounts and use parental controls and restrictions on certain content); enable all Plex mobile applications on all devices and platforms simply by logged in to your account in the app; and more! If you have a large media library and hate going around the hard drive (or five) or you like watching and listening to your stuff anywhere, then Plex is perfect for you. Free to download; The Plex Pass is \$4.99 per month, \$39.99 annually, or \$119.99 for a lifetime subscription – Download now 1Password 1Password is another app that's free to download, but you end up having to pay to keep using it (downloading gives you a free 30-day trial). This is your one-stop login store and lets you save passwords to almost any account in your life, helping you change them randomly, making them stronger – all you have to remember is your 1Password password! 1Password isn't just a star password management app; it can also hold credit card numbers, addresses – absolutely any information you consider sensitive can be locked in your own vault just for your eyes. The app works with TouchID, making it more secure, only allowing those with your fingerprints to log in (i.e., you, duh). There's also the Apple Watch app, which lets you decide which information you want to quickly access on your watch, and the small screen makes it ideal! Free to download; The 1Password subscription is \$2.99 a month, billed annually; 1Password Family is \$4.99 a month, billed annually – Download now Fantastical 2 There is a calendar app and there is a calendar app, and then there is Fantastical 2. First, it's pretty; It just looks great. It has a fun interface that's easy to read and follow, and fast. That's the whole point of Fantastical. Second, it has cool features, such as natural language parsing, reminders, an expanded keyboard when creating new events or reminders (you don't know how useful it is until you use it!), and more. One of the coolest features is the natural language parser, which allows you to simply type in phrases, such as a romantic dinner with Rene on a Friday at 8 p.m., and then automatically turn it into a calendar event, reminding you of that day. If you have a crazy busy schedule and not much time to enter the show at the regimental house, then Fantastical 2 will save you a lot of time. This is basically a written calendar/reminder version of Siri! Don at Tom's Guide also thinks Fantastical 2 is worth the moolah let's say grab your standard Calendar app that comes with iOS and offers better features on all fronts. Enlight I can't do the best app post without one for photo fans or Cella will hide me. Enlight is SO. Cool. It was selected as An Application in the App Store in eight countries, including Canada, uh, and it was the App of the Year runner up in the US, and it was still awesome two years later! Enlight is the photo editing app of your dreams, combining the features of many apps into one, a beautiful interface, allowing you complete control over colors, tones, details, masking, and a host of sweet effects (such as mixing and outlining - you can make some very neat shit). You can change the image to make it look like graffiti or pencil sketches, and you can layer photos, change certain objects in them, improve over-exposure and more, like tons. Enlight is basically a hipster Photoshop for your iPhone – but in a really awesome way. If you like post-production photography-appropriate, then definitely check out Enlight. Scanner Pro If you want to bring your documents or you need to send a lot of them and do not have time to dig up an ancient device they call a fax machine, then Scanner Pro you have discussed massively. It lets you take a photo of a document with your iPhone and then save it as a PDF, and even automatically recognize a certain type of document, cutting it accordingly. You can then upload the scan directly to your favorite cloud storage app. It's just the tip of the iceberg. Scanner Pro also lets you share whatever you scan, and can turn text in an image into text you can select and copy, while recognizing 21 languages. You can even edit the scan, and each edit is remembered, so you can go back and flip or repeat the edits however you like. There's also an iMessage extension that lets you take and edit document photos directly in the Messages app. It's all about the workflow, baby! If you deal with physical documents regularly and need a quick, easy, and reliable way to digitize them and share them, then Scanner Pro is the only way to go (and not just because of that text). V for Wikipedia I would never have known about this app if it weren't for TechRadar, and I'm sure glad I found it. Be real – you'll still use Wikipedia, so why not have it all in a convenient and really pretty app – easily the most elegant Wikipedia app for the iPhone at the time. V (formerly Viki) made the Best App Store list of 2016 because it more than just gives you information – it helps you find out more about where you live! The Nearby Place feature helps you discover more about landmarks and local areas, and you can explore the whole world using the app's map. Most Read Articles Section You see what other people see, and search is a complete Wikipedia experience (unlike when searching in the YouTube app will bring up different results than you get online – remember that junk?). Why pay for the Wikipedia application? Because V is slimmer and more elegant than wikipedia web this can help you learn more about your corner of the world; and it's more than just Wikipedia at face value – it takes all the benefits of Wikipedia and gives them practical applications. Sky Guide AR Sky Guide AR is an augmented reality app that shows you a map of the sky and tells you about almost everything you can see and a lot of things you can't see. It's the perfect companion for your new iPhone X, so you can harness all the goodness and power of ARKit graphics. You calibrate the app, usually by discovering where the Sun or Moon happens to be, and then moving your iPhone around to find out which constellations are which, which planets are there, and what random star names are. If you're really excited to see a particular planet or constellation, you can search for it, or the app has a list of Sky Guide settings to let you know which celestial events you'll see that night and at what time. The included Apple Watch app will even give you a quick rundown of what you can see at any given moment.
