Valorant combines so many elements from other genres that it creates something completely new. The game plays like CS:GO, for sure, but after a few rounds it is clear that Valorant is working on a different level. It is captivating, complex and, best of all, free to play. Call of Duty: Mobile We didn't think a Call of Duty game on mobile devices would be worth playing, but after the success of games like PUBG Mobile we are ready to give Activision and Tencent the benefit of the doubt with Call of Duty: Mobile. We're glad we did it because it's one of the best first-person shooters we've ever played on a phone, and arguably even more addictive than as a Console and PC games of the series.
